CONTESTS

NORTH EAST NEEDLEWORK CONTESTS

Open to the public, No product Requirements.

There are 12 classes for competition –Afghans, doilies, embroidery, 3-piece baby set, plastic canvas, counted cross stitch, adult garment, latch hook, quilted wall hanging, stuffed toy, baby blanket and child or adult garment sewn.

ALL items submitted for judging must be clean and odor free and made in the current year.

Judging at State level only. Subordinate and Pomona judging are not required.

All first place State winners will compete at the North East finals at the Big E

**NEW ** SPECIAL CONTEST FOR MEN – 2021 - 2022

Create window box in any medium. The only restriction in the size. It can be no larger than 12'" x 12" x 12" Judging will be on workmanship and creativity. **Window boxes will be returned.**

TABLE DECORATION CONTEST - 2021 - 2022

Create a decoration to place on a table as a centerpiece using any material. Judging will be on workmanship and creativity. The only restriction is the size, it cannot be more than 12" x 12" x 12". Judging is at State level only. This contest is for Connecticut only and will not go on to North East Judging. **Centerpiece will be returned.**

THEME CRAFT CONTEST – 2021 - 2022

The Craft Contest Theme for the next year is "Pumpkins". You may make any item, in any medium that has anything to do with Pumpkins. <u>Judging will be at State level only</u>. There are 2 categories: Needlework and Other medium. There will be Adult and Youth class in each category.

Craft entries will not be returned (there are no exceptions). They are retained by the State CWA/Family Activities Committee to be distributed at their discretion.

Baking Contest - 2021 - 2022

Open to Grange members, children, grand-children of members and Junior Grange members. The contest is for Pumpkin Spice Cookies. Submit five (5) on a plate. Put your name and Grange on the back of the plate. Judging for the baking contest is held at the State level only, <u>no Subordinate or Pomona judging is necessary</u>.

Pumpkin Spice Cookies

Yield 30 cookies

Ingredients:

2½ cups all-purpose flour, spooned and leveled
2 teaspoons cornstarch
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
¾ teaspoon baking soda
¼ teaspoon salt
2 teaspoons cinnamon
½ teaspoon nutmeg

1/8 teaspoon ground cloves
3/4 cup unsalted butter, softened to room temperature
3/4 cup packed brown sugar
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1 large egg
2 teaspoons vanilla
1/2 cup canned pumpkin (not pumpkin pie fill

For the Cinnamon Sugar Coating

¼ cup granulated sugar1½ teaspoons cinnamon

Directions: preheat oven to 350 degrees F. and line 2 cookie trays with parchment paper or silicone baking mats.

- 1. Whisk together the flour, cornstarch, cream of tartar, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg & ground cloves.
- 2. In a separate large bowl beat together the butter and sugars until fluffy. Turn the mixer down to low then beat in the egg, vanilla and pumpkin.
- 3. Slowly add in the flour mixture. The dough will be very sticky.
- 4. Cover the bowl with clingfilm and refrigerate for at least 2 hours or up to 2 days.
- 5. When ready to bake, take the dough out of the fridge.
- 6. In a small bowl whisked together the sugar and cinnamon for the cinnamon sugar coating.
- 7. Form the dough into balls of about 1.5 tablespoons in size, then roll in the cinnamon sugar coating and flatten slightly
- 8. Place the cookies on the cookie sheets about 2 inches apart. Bake for about 8-10 minutes until the tops look just set

<u>Prizes for the needlework contest at the State level will be:</u> 1st Place-\$15.00, 2nd Place- \$10.00, 3rd Place - \$5.00.

<u>Prizes for the Craft and Baking Contests at the State level will be:</u> 1st Place - \$10.00, 2nd Place - \$5.00, 3rd - Place \$3.00

Every effort will be made to distribute the prize money within 30 days.

Judging will be determined and we will let you know once the dates are set.
